Ethical Standards

Authorship

All manuscripts submitted to Journal of the Japan Society for Respiratory Endoscopy (JJSRE) must be the authors' original work, and does not duplicate any other previously published work. If authors wish to submit a translated version of previously published manuscript, the authors must obtain approval from the editors-in-chief of both primary journal and JJSRE prior to submission. In addition, the translated version must indicate that it is a translated publication in its title and cite the primary reference.

The authors are fully responsible for the contents of their submitted manuscripts. All records and data presented in the manuscript must be accurate, without any fabrication, manipulation or falsification.

All authors listed in the manuscript should have made substantial contribution to the conception or design of the work, collection and interpretation of the data, and drafting of the manuscript. Manuscripts must be read and approved by all authors prior to submission. Gifted or honorary authorship is not permitted.

Authors must ensure that their manuscript has been submitted only to JJSRE and has not been copyrighted, published, submitted or accepted for publication elsewhere.

All information and contents that originates from the other resources must be credited and cited as guided in the Instructions for Authors (<http://www.jsre.org/e/document/instructions.pdf>).

If any tables, figures, charts or any other materials from any previously published materials are to be used in the manuscript, it is the authors' responsibility to obtain the written permission from the copyright holders of those materials prior to submission.

Any potential conflict of interest needs to be declared during the submission process. Authors are required to submit the Conflict of Interest Disclosure Statement (Form 2-B) along with the manuscript, as described in the Information for Authors.

Responsibilities of Reviewers

Reviewers are expected to provide objective reviews, in a timely manner, to improve the quality of published manuscript of JJSRE.

All contents, ideas and any other information provided by the editors, authors, and editorial office must remain confidential. Printing and photocopying is only allowed for reviewing-purpose, and must not retain the copies after the reviewing is completed.

Reviewers must remain anonymous to the authors. This means that the reviewers are not allowed to reveal their identities to the authors. Also, reviewers are not allowed to contact the authors directly before, during, or after the reviewing process to discuss any information that is presented in the manuscript. In addition, reviewers must not suggest the authors to cite and include their own previous works for commercial or for their own professional purposes.

Reviewer must inform the editors if there is any potential conflict of interest (such as financial, institutional, or any collaborative relationship) with the authors of assigned manuscript.

Suspicion of any conflict of interest, duplicated publication, fabrication of data, or plagiarism must be report to the editor immediately.

Responsibilities of the Editors

Editors must understand the objectives and purpose of the JJSRE and evaluate the submitted manuscripts based on scientific and professional objectives. All submitted manuscripts should be handled without any discrimination.

If there is any potential conflict of interest (such as financial, institutional, or any collaborative relationship) with the authors of assigned manuscript, the editors must inform the Editor-in-Chief immediately.

All possible misconducts need to be reported to the Editor-in-Chief, whom will report to the Editorial Board of JJSRE for investigation.

Misconducts and Breach of Publication Ethics

Any identified misconducts are subject to investigation by the Editorial Board of JJSRE. All misconducts and breach of publication ethics, regardless of its level, may result in retraction,

publication of formal notice of the misconduct, and formal embargo on future contribution to JJSRE for a certain period of time.
